<u>HEALTH MINISTRY</u>

CPR CLASSES

As a health ministry committee, we listen to the needs of the staff and the congregation. This past spring, there was a request to offer CPR classes. Two classes, offered in May, were taught by our health ministry member Crystal Phalen, an advanced EMT, and also by Melissa Rettke, a critical care paramedic. There were eight spots available for each class and they were able to train six people. In the fall, we will offer the classes again and a reminder will be sent to those who sign up. In the future, please check the weekly bulletin and the *FOCUS* for more information.



There are several reasons why CPR is so important to know. First, CPR saves lives. More than 300,000 people have cardiac arrests in the U.S. every year. The longer the body goes without circulation, the lower the chance of survival. By performing CPR, you are able to help keep the person's blood circulating until an ambulance arrives and more advanced tools can be used.

Secondly, CPR is not performed enough. When people are asked why they would not give CPR, a very common answer is they have never received training. Other concerns, such as doing harm to the person, doing harm to oneself, legal risks or concerns about infection, often diminish once people learn the proper CPR techniques.

Finally, You don't have to do mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. In 2010, the guidelines for performing CPR were changed. Hands-Only CPR has been shown to be just as effective for many adults who experience cardiac arrest. Hands-Only CPR is easy to learn. The goal is to find the learning technique that works for you so you are comfortable if you are in a situation where you can save a life!

PASTOR'S COLUMN

"Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times in all ways. The Lord be with all of you." (2 Thessalonians 3:16)


The apostle Paul underscored the essential nature of peace in 2 Thessalonians 3:16. Did you notice how crucial he considered peace to be? "At all times." "In all ways." Peace can be possible in any situation, but we cannot produce it on demand. In fact, we cannot produce it at all. It is a fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22).

We have Christ's peace. It has already been given to us if we have received Christ. We just don't always know how to activate it.

Have you experienced a time when you were surrendered to Christ in difficult times, and you found His peace beyond understanding? Can you also say that you have had an absence of peace in much less difficult circumstances? Have you ever wondered what the difference was?

Peace comes in situations that completely surrendered to are the sovereign authority of Christ. Sometimes when we have finally given up trying to discover all the answers to the "whys" in our lives and decide to trust a sovereign God, unexpected peace washes over us like a summer rain. We sometimes lack peace in far less strenuous circumstances

because we are not as desperate or as likely to turn them over to God.



I have had to turn some of the hurts of my life over to Christ's sovereign authority because I realized they would consume me like a cancer. When at last I allowed Him to govern everything concerning my past, not only did the Savior give me His peace, but He also actually brought good from something horrible and unfair. If you have not yet bowed the knee to God's authority over areas of your past, something is holding you captive.

Christ desperately wants His people to experience His peace. The Greek word "klaio" is the strongest word used in the New Testament for grief. It means "to weep, wail, lament, implying not only the shedding of tears, but also every external expression of grief." Christ wept on several occasions, but on only one occasion is His grief described with the word "klaio." That occasion is found in Luke 19:41–42. As Jesus approached the city of Jerusalem, He wept over it and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace — but now it is hidden from your eyes."

Christ still grieves when He sees hearts in unnecessary turmoil. You can have the peace of Christ, no matter what your circumstances; but we must believe, bend the knee, and learn to receive.

There are a few reasons why we are so reluctant to submit to God's authority, but we must remember that bending the knee is a matter of pure obedience. You may never want to give your circumstance, hurt, or loss to Him; but you can choose to submit to His authority out of belief and obedience rather than emotion. Obedience is always the mark of authentic surrender to God's authority.

When I finally bent the knee to God over hurts in my past, I realized He was directing me to forgive the person who hurt me. God did not insist on my forgiving for the sake of that person but for peace in my life. Once I began to

complete authority. He is God, the Creator of the heavens and the earth, the supreme Author of all existence.



He reigns overall, and in Him all things exist. He is Lord, the Master and Owner of all living creatures. He is the covenant Maker and Keeper. He is holy. As Lord, He will never ask anything of us that is not right, good, and open to the light. He is perfect and undefiled. Lastly, He is Redeemer, the One who bought us from sin's slave master so we could experience abundant life. He bought us to set us free. "What, then, shall we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31).

What do you suppose would happen if we paid attention to God's commands? We do not have to wonder, because He told us clearly: "If only you had paid attention to my commands, your peace would have been like a river, your righteousness like the waves of the sea" (Isa. 48:18).

Take pleasure in knowing that God inspired His Word with great care and immaculate precision. He chose every word purposely. When He said we could have peace like a river in Isaiah 48:18, He was not drawing a loose analogy. He meant it. What does it take to have this peace? Attention to God's commands (by obedience) through

> the power of the Holy Spirit. Obedience to God's authority not only brings

surrender to Him in this painful area, He began to give me a supernatural ability to forgive. A segment of Scripture in Isaiah beautifully reveals the relationship between obedience, authority, and peace. God has a right to all authority because of who He is: "This is what the Lord says — your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: 'I am the Lord your God, who teaches you what is best for you, who directs you in the way you should go" (Isa. 48:17).

Did you notice the titles by which the Lord refers to Himself in the passage? Allow me to reverse the order and share my outlook on His right to

peace like a river but righteousness like the waves of the sea. Not righteous perfection. Righteous consistency.

You see, God's way is the safe way. The right way. And the only peaceful way in a chaotic world. I hope you have discovered that peace is not beyond your reach. It is not a goal to meet one day. You can begin a life of authentic peace today. Right now. The path to peace is paved with knee-prints. Bend the knee to His trustworthy authority. "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts" (Col. 3:15).





KEEPING YOU, THE MEMBERS OF ZION, INFORMED

In the May issue of *FOCUS*, you were informed we were and are striving to make our church a safer place to be at all times. Since then the property, technology committees and Church Council have worked in partnership to further our efforts towards this goal.

Reflecting on multiple resources of how we might facilitate a safer ZION Lutheran Church, the property committee took the lead their past committee meeting to brainstorm a list of projects/ideas to work towards in this area of concern. The end result was a list of 13 future improvements to our safety that were prioritized, at their meeting on June 13.

Certainly, this task force is concerned with ZION's greatest risks when they prioritize that list. But they will also consider the ease/difficulties, and the cost, and human resources to implement a solution. As we progress towards a safer ZION Lutheran Church, we will be looking to develop a **"Safety Team,"** dedicated to this area of ministry.
