PASTOR'S COLUMN

66Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

— Philippians 4:6

It is good to be reminded about gratitude because it is not always in our hearts or on our minds. No, instead of gratitude, anxiety is. St. Paul wrote something very similar in his letter to the Christians in Philippi, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Anxiety, by definition, is an overwhelming sense of apprehension about the events in our lives and our ability to cope with them. A survey conducted by the National Institute of Health reported that nearly 50 percent of us deal with anxiety almost every day. Worries, doubts, fears, insecurities and like enter our hearts and minds and stay there, causing us to live uncertain, unhappy lives.

Anxiety, if you will, should concern us because it is a First Commandment issue. When we worry, doubt, fret, and become apprehensive about the people and circumstances in our lives, we stop trusting that our Heavenly Father will care for us. We assume that role for ourselves. And, when God is gone, so is gratitude.

When you read Paul's letter, you will note that there was discord, division, self-centeredness and arrogance among the disciples. Many looked to their own interests and not that of others. And, when they looked chiefly at themselves, they stopped looking at God. It is difficult to be grateful to God when He holds little to no place in our life.

Our situation has some similarities but is not the same. Yes, there are selfcentered people around us. Yes, some are vainly arrogant and rude. But, even more, we worry about the economy and our ability to pay our bills. We worry about our country, unending wars, and political gamesmanship. We fret about Covid, RSV, the flu and health issues. We are concerned about our children. Like the Philippians, God is present in our thoughts but not usually in His rightful place. And, gratitude is gone.

Instead, St. Paul urges us, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Allow me to give you an example that helps us understand. A man invited a friend to go hear a preacher, saying, "I want you to hear the most thankful preacher I've ever heard." The two men weathered a ferocious storm to hear the man deliver a sermon. On the way to the church, they thought no one would be there; they doubted if even the preacher would be present. Happily, for them, when they arrived, they found the preacher sitting in a chair near the pulpit. The stranger said to his friend, "He has no one to listen. There's a storm outside. It looks like we will have a flood. He certainly will not have anything to be thankful for tonight!" "Let's listen and see," said the friend. When the preacher finally stood up, he asked to begin with a prayer and said, "Dear Lord, it is stormy outside. It looks as if the roads will wash away before we can get out of the church tonight. It's an awful storm. But we who are here, are thankful that it's not always this way." A prayer of thanksgiving even in the middle of turbulence!

It is a reminder of Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night of Judas' betrayal and Jesus' eventual arrest and crucifixion. He asked with great passion, "Father, let this cup of suffering pass from Me if it be Your will ... but, let Your will be done." Then, strengthened by His Father amid horrible circumstances and a waiting cross, Jesus embraced the circumstances and sacrificed Himself so that we might have forgiveness, life, and hope — no matter what. Through faith in Him, we have every reason to be grateful. Every day. In every circumstance. And, to express it with prayers of thanksgiving like the one you know well: "Oh, give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good and His mercy endures forever."

One of my favorite cartoons in the newspaper is Family Circus, drawn by Bill Keane. One year near Thanksgiving, Keane included the Grandmother and Billy, the oldest of the children. With a turkey sitting on the table in the background, Grandma looked down at Billy and said with a warm smile, "Billy, always remember to count your blessings!" Billy looked back at Grandma and said sincerely, "But, I'm not good at arithmetic."

Neither are we when it comes to counting the innumerable blessings our Heavenly Father gives us — faith, family, food, friends, health, home, church, community, country. All are His gifts to us by grace. Let us remember them not only on Thanksgiving Day, but every day of our lives.

LWR INGATHERING THANK YOU

Fri., Oct. 6, what a marvelous morning ... a great day to welcome people from area churches who brought boxes of quilts, blankets, school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits and fabric kits for the Fall Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Ingathering. ZION was blessed to have 32 volunteers plus Confirmation students to help. The Confirmation students brought the boxes of quilts, blankets, school kits and personal care kits upstairs and taped the boxes shut to be ready for Friday morning. That was a tremendous help for ZION's Mission Quilters. From all churches participating, we sent a total of 2,083 quilts, six blankets, 572 school kits, 400 personal care kits, 220 baby care kits and two fabric kits. ZION's share was 203 quilts, 3 blankets, 50 school kits and 43 personal care kits. The semi-trailer was half full! It was a privilege to be instrumental in doing our part in getting these items to the LWR Minneapolis warehouse to be shipped throughout the world wherever there is need. Thank you to each of the volunteers for giving up their time to help and the Confirmation students for helping in this stewardship event. R

NEW BOOKS

Swindoll's *Living Insights New Testament Commentary Matthew 1-15* by Charles R. Swindoll.

What a profound and powerful message to kick off the opening pages of the New Testament! After 400 years of prophetic silence, many of God's waiting people may have wondered whether He had forgotten His promises and deserted them. But then Jesus arrived with an offer of the kingdom, based on one condition – faith. Faith in a Messiah who met very few people's expectations. Faith in a kingdom advancing through peace rather than war. Faith in a God who cared not only for His people, Israel, but for the whole world! Get ready to meet your God!

Rock on Kindness! Pass It On! by Stepheni Curran* is about a 7-year-old girl named Ally whose favorite hobby is painting and hiding rocks to bring happiness to others. In the story, Ally, creates opportunities for the reader to make predictions and learn new vocabulary as she introduces the reader to her five best friends who will be receiving her painted rocks. The best friends include Ty, Katie, Noah, Latifa and Max. Ally explains how she met every friend and notes how she met every friend and notes their uniqueness as these friends differ in race, preferred language, religion, etc. Despite these differences, Ally finds similar ties between herself and every her friends. The theme of moving past differences to find common interests and create friendships is reiterated throughout the story.

Rock On, Kindness! Even When Your Heart Hurts! by Stepheni Curran* is the second children's book in the Rock On, Kindness! Series. This story is about a 9-year-old boy named Ty who wants to do something special for his grandpa's birthday, as his grandpa recently passed away. In the story, Ty takes the reader on an adventure by painting kindness rocks for four of his friends in celebration of his grandpa's birthday. These four friends include Luke, Stacey, Zane, and Lily. Ty has chosen to paint kindness rocks for these friends so each friend is experiencing a personal challenge, such as moving to a new city, giving a class presentation while having a fear of public speaking, dealing with the deployment of a parent, and having a parent who is battling cancer. Ty teaches the reader about the importance of kindness, compassion for others, friendship, expressing emotions, positive coping strategies, diversity, and inclusion. This story takes difficult topics and embeds them into an engaging, interactive, and thoughtprovoking read for children ages six through 12, with opportunities for personal discussions along the way! R
