

The quilts we bless today are a part of a long tradition of quilting and kit making dating back to 1945, when the Lutheran World Relief (LWR) distributed its first quilts to families in war-torn Europe following the World War II.

"Over the past 25 years, Lutheran World Relief (LWR) has distributed over 9,191.127 quilts, which would cover 11 square miles or half of Manhattan <u>AND</u> 9,493,141 school bags, enough for more than one to every person in Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota and Nebraska combined. They've been shipped around the globe where needed most."

Eventually, these quilts and school kits we bless today, will be distributed anywhere in the world where there is a need. In time, over one hundred countries have already benefited by these ZLCW gifts of love. If there is a need among refugees, disaster survivors, or vulnerable communities these quilts will find a new home. They are not only practical items that provide warmth and comfort, but also become symbols of love and solidarity with those in need. They perhaps will be used as blankets, tents, floor coverings, curtains, wall-dividers or even as a way to carry belongings.

Maybe most important, is what we bless today as a congregation, is to recognize Christ at work through the dedication and ministries of ZION Lutheran Church Women.

 - ALL: Lord, teach us, also, to use our talents to reach out to the world's downtrodden people as these quilters have learned to do.
- <u>LEADER</u>: Jesus, we ask that you continue to bless the work of the quilters of our congregation, the ZION Lutheran Church Women and Lutheran World Relief.
 - <u>ALL</u>: Bless their work, O Lord, and may it draw people to you.
